### Maths

### English

Write a job advertisement for a Viking Warrior. EG Wanted - Viking Warrior. Must be.... Must be able to ... Must be good at.....

### Recipe for a raid

You will need: 20 angry Vikings, 1 longboat 1 monastery several peaceful Anglo-Saxon monks. A selection of weapons Write your own 'Recipe for a Raid'.

Research the Anglo Saxons. Where did they come from?

Write a paragraph on why they came to Britain.

With your family, create a list of 5 nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs. Who can make the silliest sentence using one word from each list?

## Foundation subjects:

Draw/print a picture of yourself and a Viking child. Label the differences between your life and their life. (Include information on school, toys, homes, pets, work).

Write some messages using Viking runes.



Choose one of the countries that the Vikings were from (Denmark, Norway, and Sweden). Find out what the country is like now and make a poster to tell people all about it.

Use a map of U.K and see how many Anglo Saxon place names you can find. If they end in -ton, -ham, -burgh what did it mean?

One parachute is half the size of another. Does this mean it falls twice as fast? Investigate.

Conduct an investigation using Friction. E.g using a toy car, test this on different surfaces to see which surface type causes the most / least friction.

Draw a force diagram showing upthrust.
