

Physical education, experienced in a safe and supportive environment, is a unique and vital contributor to a pupil's physical development and well-being. Through the selection of suitably differentiated tasks, it is intended that pupils, irrespective of their starting ability, will enjoy success and be motivated to further develop their individual potential.

At Sheriffhales Primary School we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better. We welcome the Government's announcement to extend the Sport Premium to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

Schools in England received £320 million funding from the PE and Sport Premium during the academic year 2020-21. The premium for the academic year is funded over two instalments. For the academic year, the first payment was paid around November while the second instalment fell in the first half of the following financial year, May time. We committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and challenges for all our young people.

Sport Funding Grant

Funding for schools is calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census in January. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil.

The school received £16,730 towards PE and Sport provision in the academic year 2019/20
The School is committed to providing high quality PE and Sport provision for all of its pupils.

The PE and Sport premium grant has enabled the school to:

- Provide some after school sports and outdoor clubs
- Promote participation in inter-school competitions through its membership of the Shropshire Schools Sports Partnership
- Purchase PE and outdoor event equipment
- Contribute to the costs of a sports focused teaching assistant
- Cover transport costs to competitions
- Share the costs of a Sports Apprentice
- Cover the cost of field markings for outdoor PE activities
- Receive specialist tuition through the SSSP
- Make the sports field fit for purpose

What has been the impact of the additional funding?

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- 30% of pupils regularly attend after school sports clubs.
- 75% of pupils actively participate in sport or dance during the evening and at weekends with a club or organisation
- 55% of pupils took part in inter-school sports competitions in Autumn terms 1+2 and Spring 1.
- 100% of Year 6 pupils were at ARE or above in PE at the end of 2019
- 91% of Year 6 pupils are already at ARE prior to COVID-19 school restrictions and pool closures

How will these improvements be sustained?

The PE and Sport grant supplements the provision provided by the school. This includes:

- High quality PE/Sport lessons
- Swimming

- An appropriate size and quality sports field
- Wider engagement with the outdoors and outdoor curriculum

Funding outlined below uses 2019/20 funding with projection into 2020/21* funding for projects which either span two academic years or are larger and sustainable projects where funding can be pro-rata.

Building on consultation with parents, and work with the ESSSP our school continues to use the Sports Premium during 2019 -20 to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision at Sheriffhales.

Our partnership with East Shropshire PE and School Sport Partnership has enabled us to develop key areas of professional development and a re-organisation of personnel identified to match the needs of the school.

Our links to East Shropshire Sports Partnership has given us access to a range of inter school competitions, festivals and leagues at different levels, where the children have had opportunities to represent the school locally. Whilst it is hoped that by 2021 some of the participation in the inter competitions and revised competitions and personal achievements recorded in school (COVID-19 adaptations) will lead to invitations to different events in the Summer Games and the Oakengates Athletics Competition, the value already gained by the children in developing not only sporting, but also life enhancing, skills is clear to see by their increased confidence in and around sport and desire to take part in sport. For the early part of 2020/2021 our practice will have to be revised, but, successful teaching of sport, games and fitness during partial closure (COVID-19) has given us lots of planning ideas and adaptations to the sporting and fitness life of the school.

Running alongside our partnership with East Shropshire, the Sports Premium enables us to offer other physical and sporting opportunities such as a gardening club on site and Bikeability training for years 3, 4 and 5. In previous years all of our children have achieved their Level 1 certificates. This year there will be an opportunity to progress to Level 2. Development of wider outdoor activity utilising our field is a key feature of our curriculum enrichment and wider offer. The previous and 'abandoned' challenge of creating the perfect sports field has given us a better opportunity altogether with rougher terrain, natural obstacles and the development of more creative physical challenges.

Residential trips can give pupils an intensive and exciting introduction to new sporting skills and knowledge. It is our intention to spend wisely but invest well in at least one, possibly two using partial funding from the sports premium.

We continue to use our partnership links and any information that they direct to us to signpost groups of children or individuals to local clubs where they can either develop new skills or challenge themselves.

We have several children who participate in sporting activity outside school on a regular basis in part due to signposting or introduction to a sport via our funding. The levels of 'stickability' are high with children who are in their 3rd year of competing for a club following signposting from school.

Overall case studies we have made demonstrate that the Sports Premium has enabled us to offer a breadth and flexibility in our sporting provision for all children, leading to increased confidence and improved general fitness and wellbeing amongst pupils. It has also had a positive impact on the training and skills of staff, especially in components like gym and swimming where CPD has supported teacher development. We are bold with our spending, partly out of necessity (location) and because it is right for the children of Sherifhales – physically, socially, spiritually and aspirationally.

Finally, we are able to use the Sports Premium to build up and maintain our stock of equipment to ensure that we can deliver a breadth of activities that will attract and motivate all children.
